# June 7, 2022 Statewide Direct Primary Election

All Santa Clara County registered voters will be mailed a Vote by Mail Ballot starting 29 days before Election Day. Inactive voters will not receive a Vote by Mail Ballot unless they update their voter registration or contact the Registrar of Voters' office.

Voters may choose to return the completed ballot by using the Free Prepaid Postage Return Envelope, at ANY Official Ballot Drop Box or ANY Santa Clara County Vote Center!

Yoters can vote in person at any Vote Center location in Santa Clara County. Vote Centers are universal polling places and will be open several days.

#### **County Voter Information Guide**

The County Voter Information Guide does not contain a complete list of candidates. A complete list of candidates appears on the sample of the ballot. Each candidate's statement is volunteered by the candidate and is printed at his or her expense.

This Guide contains pages regarding candidate statements and/or ballot measures, analyses, and arguments (whichever apply to your ballot). Arguments in support of or in opposition to proposed measures are the opinions of the authors and have not been checked for accuracy by any official agency.

Although the materials provided in this Guide have been carefully proofread, typographical errors occasionally remain undetected. If a substantive error is discovered after the Guide has been printed, a correction notice will be issued.

#### Language Assistance

The County of Santa Clara provides voting materials in English to all registered voters. In addition, as required by law, the Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters provides voting materials in Chinese, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese. Official Ballots are produced in the additional languages of Hindi, Japanese, Khmer, and Korean. Facsimile Ballots are available upon request in Gujarati, Nepali, Punjabi, Tamil, and Telugu languages. To ensure our records are correct, the County began conducting a Preferred Language Survey in November 2004. Voters may change their language preference at any time by calling the office or by mailing/faxing in a completed VOTER'S ACTION REQUEST FORM located in this guide.

The office of the Registrar of Voters continues to prioritize multilingual services to improve services to all voters, including those who primarily speak another language other than English.

Dear Santa Clara County Voter,

I hope you are doing well and preparing your voting plan for the June 7, 2022 Statewide Direct Primary Election. Every ten years following the census, California's district lines are redrawn. You may find your districts may have changed since the last time you voted. You can find more information about redistricting and how to look up your districts inside of this Guide.

Santa Clara County is conducting elections under the California Voter's Choice Act model, which was successfully implemented in the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary Election. Here are some key benefits to your voting experience:

- You choose how to vote: You can vote through the mail (all voters will automatically be mailed a ballot 29 days before Election Day), at a Vote Center or drop off your ballot at an Official Ballot Drop Box.
- You choose when to vote: You can vote at our office beginning 29 days before Election Day or you have up to 11 days, including Election Day, to vote at any Vote Center.
- You choose where to vote: You can visit any Vote Center in Santa Clara County. All Vote Centers will have enhanced voting equipment and will be staffed to provide assistance in multiple languages, helping voters with disabilities, and updating your voter registration information. If you choose to vote at a Vote Center, we will be following the current health and safety guidelines in place at the time.

All Vote Centers will be offering Conditional Voter Registration allowing voters to register to vote and cast a ballot even if they missed the voter registration deadline. Locations and hours of the Vote Centers are available in this Guide and posted online at **www.sccvote.org**.

For Vote by Mail voters, the Registrar of Voters' Office continues to offer prepaid postage for voters returning their ballots by mail as long as it is mailed in the United States.

To increase efficiency, save taxpayer funds, and reduce the impact on the environment, the Registrar of Voters' Office offers all of the information in this Guide online as a downloadable PDF file in a format that is also accessible for persons with disabilities. If you would like to receive your Guide electronically, visit the Registrar of Voters' Office website at **www.sccvote.org** and click on the **"Go Green"** icon.

### Information for Voters with Disabilities

#### **REMOTE ACCESSIBLE VOTE BY MAIL SYSTEM**

Voters with disabilities can now vote privately and independently by marking their ballot in a screen-readable format from a home computer using their own assistive technology.

All voters are able to access their specific ballot by visiting www.sccvote.org/RAVBM starting 29 days before Election Day and entering their information through a secure portal. All ballots must be printed and follow the return instructions provided at the portal.

Voters can return their voted ballot by mail (must be postmarked by Election Day), or at any Official Ballot Drop Box, or at any Vote Center location.

#### IN PERSON VOTING

The Registrar of Voters strives to provide Vote Center locations that are accessible to the elderly and voters with disabilities.

The County of Santa Clara's new electronic voting system gives visually impaired voters the ability to cast a secret ballot without assistance. The voting system is equipped with an audio voting component that allows voters to listen to the ballot and make their choices using the keypad provided. The keypad includes a "sip and puff" feature as well.

Voters who are unable to mark a ballot may bring up to two individuals to assist them in voting.



# **Paper Ballot Voting Instructions**

#### How to Mark Your Paper Ballot:

- Fill in the Oval to the right of your selection completely
- Use a black or blue ink pen. NO RED INK.
- Do not use check marks, X's, lines or circles
- No personal info or identification marks on your Official Ballot

#### Write-In Voting:

- Print the name of the qualified write-in candidate in the blank space provided
- Fill in the oval completely to the right of the write-in space
- Do not write in a candidate name already printed on the ballot

Avoid Over-Voting. To ensure your vote counts, do not vote for more candidates than allowed for each contest.

If you make a **mistake**, request a replacement Ballot or if there is not enough time to receive a replacement ballot by mail, you may correct it by crossing out the wrong choice and filling out the correct oval as shown in picture.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS**

To vote, completely fill in the oval to the right of your choice. Use blue or black ink to mark your ballot. NO RED INK.

#### Write-in voting:

To vote for a qualified write-in candidate whose name is not on the ballot, write the person's name in the blank space provided and FILL IN THE OVAL to the right. If you make a mistake, request a new ballot.





#### INSTRUCCIONES PARA LOS VOTANTES

#### Voto Escrito:

#### Voter-Nominated and Nonpartisan Offices

All voters, regardless of the party preference they disclosed upon registration, or refusal to disclose a party preference, may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated or nonpartisan office. The party preference, if any, designated by a candidate for a voter-nominated office is selected by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party or that the party approves of the candidate. The party preference, if any, of a candidate for a nonpartisan office does not appear on the ballot.

#### Cargos Nominados por los Votantes y No Partidarios

Todos los votantes, sin importar la preferencia de partido que hayan revelado al inscribirse, o su negativa de revelar una preferencia de partido, pueden votar por cualquier candidato a un cargo nominado por los votantes o no partidario. La preferencia de partido, si la hubiera, designada por un candidato a un cargo nominado por los votantes, es seleccionada por el candidato y se muestra solo para la información de los votantes. No implica que el candidato esté nominado ni ratificado por el partido ni que el partido apruebe al candidato. La preferencia de partido, si la hubiera, de un candidato por un cargo no partidario, no aparece en la boleta electoral.

There are two U.S. Senate contests on the June 7, 2022, Primary Election ballot.


The first contest is the regular election for the full 6-year term ending January 3, 2029.

The second contest is a special vacancy election (the current officeholder is temporarily filling a vacancy) for the remainder of the current term ending January 3, 2023.

You may vote for both contests.

### Redistricting

Every ten years following the census, California's district lines are redrawn. This election uses the new district lines for Congress, State Senate, State Assembly, State Board of Equalization District 2, County Board of Supervisors, and City of San José City Council Districts. You may find you do not live in the same districts you did the last time you voted. Because of this, your ballot may have different contests and candidates than you are used to seeing; and in some cases, your previous representative may not be a candidate for your new district.



Voters may look up their election districts by visiting <u>www.sccvote.org</u> and selecting the icon "<u>Look Up Your District</u>" under our Popular Services link on our home page. Voters can also access a list of their elected representatives within Santa Clara County at <u>www.sccvote.org</u> under the "Candidates & Measures" drop down menu by selecting the List of Officeholders.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR VOTERS

Since the 2010 Primary Election, there have been many changes that affect how you vote. Please take a moment to read about these changes.

**Top Two Candidates Open Primary Act:** Proposition 14, passed by voters in 2010, changed the way primary elections are conducted in California. All "partisan" offices, except for President and party central committee, are now "voter-nominated" offices.

- You may choose any candidate running for a voter-nominated office, regardless of the party you or the candidate prefers.
- For this election, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Controller, Treasurer, Attorney General, Insurance Commissioner, State Board of Equalization, District 2, United States Senate, United States Representative, State Senate, and State Assembly are voter-nominated offices.
- The two candidates with the highest number of votes in the primary election, regardless of party preference, go on to the general election ballot. There may be two candidates with the same party preference on your ballot for some voter-nominated offices.

#### COUNTY COUNSEL'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE A

California law permits the governing body of a district to propose an initiative limiting the number of terms that a member of the governing body may serve. The Santa Clara Valley Water District Board of Directors (Board) placed on the ballot a measure to amend Ordinance 11-01 of the Santa Clara Valley Water District by increasing the number of terms that members of the Board may serve from three successive four-year terms to four successive four-year terms. The only amendment made by this measure is increasing by one the number of consecutive terms a member of the Board of Directors may serve.

Full terms or partial terms served after December 3, 2010 and prior to the effective date of this measure are included for the purpose of computing successive terms, such that a member of the Board who has served three successive terms after December 3, 2010 will be eligible to serve only one more consecutive term. After serving a fourth successive term, a member of the Board will not be eligible to serve again until after at least four years of absence from service as a member of the Board.

A "yes" vote is a vote to approve the amendment to Ordinance 11-01, increasing the number of terms that members of the Board may serve to four successive four-year terms.

A "no" vote is a vote to reject the amendment to Ordinance 11-01.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 11-01

#### AMENDMENT OF THE TERM LIMITS ORDINANCE OF THE SANTA CLARA VALLEY WATER DISTRICT LIMITING THE NUMBER OF TERMS A BOARD MEMBER MAY SERVE AS A DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER

The Board of Directors of Santa Clara Valley Water District does ORDAIN as follows:

#### **SECTION 1**

- A. No person elected or appointed as a District board member in any district, after the effective date of this ordinance, may serve as a District board member in any district, for more than three four\_successive four-year terms. The foregoing does not disqualify any person from serving on the District Board for any term or terms after at least four years of absence in which the person has not served as a Board member.
- B. For the purpose of this ordinance, a person is deemed to have served a full four-year term if either of the following applies:
  - i. The person was appointed to serve as a District board member in any district, and has completed in excess of two years of a four-year term.
  - ii. The person is a District board member who resigns with less than two full years remaining until the expiration of the term.

#### **SECTION 2**

Full terms or partial terms served prior to the effective date of this ordinance are not included in terms of computing consecutive terms. The effective date of this ordinance is December 3, 2010.

Measure A will help this complex project begin immediately, managed by consistent board leadership and saving potentially millions of taxpayer dollars. Given other critical water resource sustainability efforts happening with regional, state and federal partners, it is wise for voters to allow Valley Water Board members to serve up to four terms to continue uniform and credibly experienced leadership.

Measure A still maintains voters' rights to remove board members and choose new leaders through regular election processes. Measure A also provides the opportunity to maintain board members with strong proven expertise for longer if the voters are happy with their performance and want to re-elect them.

Santa Clara Valley Water District is alone among 2,500 California special districts in requiring term limits. Given the need for consistent expertise on district boards, supporting Measure A will ensure Santa Clara County maintains critical experience during this historic period of water resource protection and resource management for everyone.

#### CITY ATTORNEY'S IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE D

In December 2017, the City of Santa Clara was named as a defendant in the matter of *Yumori-Kaku, et al. v. City of Santa Clara* (case no. 17CV319862). The Plaintiffs alleged that the City's at-large method of electing its City Council Members violated the California Voting Rights Act. In June and July 2018, the Santa Clara County Superior Court issued a judgement in favor of the Plaintiffs, and ordered the City to transition to a "by-district" method of electing its City Council Members, with the Mayor continuing to be elected "at-large." This decision was upheld by the Sixth District Court of Appeal in December 2020. Meanwhile, the 2018 and 2020 elections for the position of Council Members were conducted in accordance with the Court's Judgment, with members elected from all six districts.

During this time period, the City's Charter was not amended to reflect the "by-district" method of Council Member election. Therefore, in April 2021, the City and the Plaintiffs entered into a settlement agreement which included a requirement that the City Council place a measure on the ballot to seek voter approval of an amendment to the City Charter that comports with the terms of the Court's Judgment. Measure D proposes the following changes to the City Charter:

- 1. <u>Section 600</u>: Candidates for the position of Council Member must reside in the district represented by the office they seek to fill for at least thirty days prior to their filing of nomination papers.
- Section 700.1: Establishes six single-member districts, with a district map previously adopted by the City Council and periodically amended by a redistricting process following each decennial Census. Order of election for the six districts shall be District 2 and 3 in 2022 (and periodic elections thereafter), and Districts 1, 4, 5 and 6 in 2024 (and periodic elections thereafter).
- 3. <u>Section 700.2</u>: Incumbent Council Members shall complete the remainder of their elected terms after a redistricting process.

The proposed changes to the City Charter fulfill the requirements of the Court's Judgment and the Settlement Agreement with the Plaintiffs in the *Yumori-Kaku* litigation. In the event the voters do not approve this Measure, the Settlement Agreement allows the Plaintiffs to seek further Court Order(s) to continue the six single-member district election process for future Council Member elections.

A "Yes" vote approves of the proposed changes to the City Charter. The Charter language would then reflect the "by-district" method used to elect the City's Council Members.

A "No" vote disapproves of the proposed changes to the City Charter. The current Charter language describing an "at-large" election system would remain in place.

#### COMPLETE TEXT OF MEASURE D

The Charter of the City of Santa Clara shall be amended as follows:

**Section 600** of the Charter of the City of Santa Clara is amended to be entitled and to read as follows:

#### Sec. 600 City elected officers.

No person shall be eligible to hold any the elective office in the City including of Mayor, City Council, or Chief of the Police Department and or City Clerk, unless he or she is a resident and a qualified registered elector of the City. No person shall be eligible to hold the elective office of City Council Member, excepting the Mayor, unless he or she is a qualified registered elector of the City and a resident in the district represented by the Council Member office.

In order to hold the elective office of Mayor, Chief of the Police Department or City Clerk a person must have been a resident of the City of Santa Clara for at least thirty (30) days immediately preceding the last day specified by law for the filing of nomination papers with the City Clerk for such office or, if appointed, preceding the date of the person's appointment to fill a vacancy.

In order to hold the elective office of Council Member, excepting the Mayor, a person must have been a resident of the City of Santa Clara and of the District represented by the person as a Council Member for at least thirty (30) days immediately preceding the last day specified by law for the filing of nomination papers with the City Clerk for such office or, if appointed, preceding the date of the person's appointment to fill a vacancy.

The elective officers of the City shall consist of a City Council composed of seven members, the Chief of the Police Department and the City Clerk. The members of the City Council, (which includes the office of the Mayor) and the Chief of the Police Department and the City Clerk shall be elected from the City at large at the times and in the manner provided in this Charter. Except as otherwise herein provided, a person elected to an office for other than an unexpired term shall serve a term of four years and shall serve until a successor is elected and qualified. The term shall commence on the date the City Council certifies the canvass of the election returns submitted to it by the County Registrar of Voters.

The person receiving the most votes cast for a particular City office shall be declared duly elected. Ties shall be broken as provided from time to time by ordinance.

The office of Mayor shall be separately voted upon and is a separate office. The person elected at any election to the office designated "Mayor" shall be deemed elected, both as a Mayor and as a member of the Council. Although the Mayor is a Council member, his or her election does not change the number of Council members from seven.

No person shall be a candidate for both Mayor and a City Council office seat at the same election. However, an incumbent member of the City Council may run for the elective office of Mayor, and the Mayor may run for the separate office

of Mayor or other City Council office. However, at no time shall a member of the Council, including the Mayor, hold more than one City elective office. Except as otherwise provided elsewhere in this Charter, no incumbent member of the City Council while serving in such office with an unexpired term of more than six months shall be a candidate for any <del>numbered</del> Council office <del>seat</del> other than the one which he or she holds.

**Section 700.1** of the Charter of the City of Santa Clara is amended to be entitled and to read as follows:

Sec. 700.1 Elections-Designation of seats.

For purposes of City Council elections, each Council office shall be designated by an appropriate descriptive designation, as follows: The Council seat which on the effective date of this Section is occupied by the Mayor shall continue to be designated as "Mayor"; each of the other six seats, respectively, shall be designated as "Council Member Seat No. 2," "Council Member Seat No. 3," "Council Member Seat No. 4," "Council Member Seat No. 5," "Council Member Seat No. 4," "Council Member Seat No. 5," "Council Member Seat No. 6" and "Council Member Seat No. 7" respectively, and shall continue to be designated by the respective designation. The designation so given to each such office shall thereafter be used in all election, nomination papers, certificates of election, and other election papers pertaining or referring to such office, and to designate incumbency in such office.

#### Sec. 700.1 Elections—City Council Districts.

Members of the City Council, excepting the Mayor, shall be elected by district. For the election to be held in November 2022 and each election thereafter, there shall be 6 (six) districts as such districts are designated on that certain map adopted by judgment of the Superior Court dated July 24, 2018, as set forth in Resolution No. 18-8585 of the City Council, as the boundaries of such districts shall be amended through a redistricting process following each decennial United States <u>Census.</u>

Council District elections shall be conducted as follows:

- a. Each District shall be represented by one (1) Council <u>Member.</u>
- b. In the election to be held in November 2022 and in each Council District election held thereafter the Council District elections shall be conducted as follows:
  - 1. <u>the voters of District 2 shall nominate and elect</u> one (1) Council Member for a four-year term; and
  - 2. <u>the voters of District 3 shall nominate and elect</u> one (1) Council Member for a four-year term.
- c. In the election to be held in November 2024 and in each Council District election held thereafter the Council District elections shall be conducted as follows
  - 1. <u>the voters of District 1 shall nominate and elect</u> <u>one (1) Council Member for a four-year term;</u>

#### COMPLETE TEXT OF MEASURE D-Continued

- 2. <u>the voters of District 4 shall nominate and elect one</u> (1) Council Member for a four-year term; and
- 3. <u>the voters of District 5 shall nominate and elect one</u> (1) Council Member for a four-year term.
- 4. <u>the voters of District 6 shall nominate and elect one</u> (1) Council Member for a four-year term.

**Section 700.2** of the Charter of the City of Santa Clara is amended to be entitled and to read as follows:

#### Sec. 700.2 Elections: Designation of Seats-Election Following Change of Boundaries

Upon any redistricting pursuant to the provisions of this section of the Charter or the ordinances enacted hereunder, each incumbent member of the Council will continue, during the remainder of the member's term, to hold office and represent the district by which the member was elected prior to such redistricting, notwithstanding any provision of Section 600 requiring a member to be a resident of the district represented by such member.

#### ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE D

In 2018, Superior Court Judge Thomas Kuhnle ruled in a California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA") lawsuit against the City of Santa Clara that the "atlarge" voting system previously used by the City impaired the ability of minorities to elect candidates as result of the dilution and abridgment of their rights as voters. As remediation, the City moved to elect council members in six districts, with the mayor elected at-large. In a unanimous decision in 2020, the State Appellate Court upheld the ruling that allowed the first council member of Asian descent to be elected in the history of the City.

Measure D would update the City Charter to be consistent with the court ruling, protect the city from further litigation, and preserve the quality and diversity of candidates in elected office.

Your YES vote will retain the district system currently in place to ensure that all parts of Santa Clara are fairly represented on city council. In addition to the geographic diversity, the move to districts also enabled minority candidates to have representation proportional to their population in the city.

With Measure D residents of districts will have easier access to council members who live in close proximity to their neighborhoods and understand the local issues.

Having to campaign throughout the entire city gave an inordinate advantage to incumbents and made it harder for new candidates to campaign effectively. Keeping our six-district system will retain diversity of opinions, backgrounds, and neighborhoods as well guard against influence from special interests by keeping campaign costs low.

Vote YES on Measure D for more diverse, locally representative government, council members who care about your community, distribution of political power, and representation for all residents.



Activate the voting machine by inserting the Voter Card into the yellow slot at the bottom of the voting machine.

**Choose** the language in which you wish to vote.

**Make your selection** by touching the candidate's name or measure response of your choice. A black checkmark will appear in the square next to the choice.



**To change your selection**, touch the selected choice again. The checkmark will disappear and you may make a new selection.

To vote for a qualified **write-in** candidate choice, touch the word **"WRITE-IN"**. When the keyboard screen appears, touch the letters of the candidate's name, then touch the **"ACCEPT"** button in the lower right-hand corner of your screen to continue.

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
To change the text size, touch the "Text Size" button and select "Normal" or "Large".



You may also change the language at any time of the voting session by selecting the **"Language"** button. Furthermore, you can change the appearance of the ballot on screen by selecting the **"View"** button.

To review your selections at any time prior to casting your ballot, touch "Review" at the bottom left of the screen. The Review screen will provide you with a summary of your selections. If you have not selected the maximum allowed selections in a contest, a warning will appear to let you know the contest is blank or under-voted. Touch the contest to return to it.

If you are satisfied with your selections, touch "Print Ballot" at the bottom right of the screen to bring up the print confirmation.



A final confirmation will appear asking you if you want to **Print your ballot** or **Review your choices**. If you want to **make a change to your selections**, touch **"Review your choices"**. If you want to **print your ballot**, touch **"Print your ballot"** and the ballot marking device will print your ballot with the choices you have made.

NOTE: You cannot change your selections after the ballot is cast.



The voting session will then be complete. The **Voter Card** will be deactivated, please return it to the Election Officer. If you have questions, please ask your Election Officer for assistance, or refer to the instructions on the side panel.

#### **Conditional Voter Registration**

Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) extends the existing 15-day registration deadline to eligible voters, allowing them to register and vote 14 days prior to an election through Election Day. An eligible voter would need to register at the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters' Office or a Vote Center to conditionally register to vote and vote a conditional ballot.

**CVR ballots will be issued at the Registrar of Voters' Office and Vote Centers.** Conditional ballots will not be mailed to voters.

In order to conditionally register, the voter must first complete an affidavit of registration. The affidavit is conveniently located on the front side of the CVR envelope. Once the affidavit is complete and submitted to the election official, a conditional ballot will be issued to the voter.

The affidavit will be processed and once the eligibility is determined and validated, the registration will become permanent and the conditional ballot will be counted. Conditional Voter Registrations are treated and processed in the same manner as other Voter Registration Applications; conditional ballots are treated and processed the same as provisional ballots.

CVR was enacted in 2012, to be operative on the January 1st after the certification of a statewide voter registration database. VoteCal, California's statewide voter registration database, was certified on September 26, 2016; CVR became operative as of January 1, 2017. Effective January 1, 2017, Conditional Voter Registration is available to eligible voters in California pursuant to Election Codes 2170 through 2173.

#### VOTER BILL OF RIGHTS

#### YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS

- 1. The right to vote if you are a registered voter. You are eligible to vote if you are:
  - ★ a U.S. citizen living in California

★ not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony

- ★ at least 18 years old
- ★ registered where you currently live

- $\star$ not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- 2. The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list. You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.
- 3. The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.
- The right to cast a secret ballot without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote. 4.
- 5. The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake, if you have not already cast your ballot. You can: Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot, Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place, or Vote using a provisional ballot.
- 6. The right to get help casting your ballot from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.
- 7. The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in California.
- 8. The right to get election materials in a language other than English if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.
- 9. The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.
- 10. The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

- Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on the day indicated in the posted county Voter Information Guide. •
- Specific instructions on how to vote, including how to cast a provisional ballot, can be obtained from a poll worker or by • reading the information mailed to you by your local elections official.
- If you are a newly registered voter, you may be asked to provide appropriate identification or other documentation according • to federal law. But please note that every individual has the right to cast a provisional ballot even if he or she does not provide the documentation.
- It is against the law to represent yourself as being eligible to vote unless you meet all of the requirements to vote under federal and state law.
- It is against the law to tamper with voting equipment. ٠


